A SUMMARY OF YOUR ARBORETUM THROUGH 2016

Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum celebrates another year as an environmental center in Middletown, one of its best, if little known, gems. The Arboretum hosted numerous educational opportunities, participated in a wide variety of community events, and worked hard on improvements. All of this was accomplished under the guidance of a volunteer Board of Directors and one part-time naturalist, and with the deepest appreciation of numerous volunteer workers!

The educational opportunities ranged from the fourth annual Winter Tree Identification Class, to free wildflower walks in the spring through the Christmas Bird Count walk the Saturday before Christmas. Bull's Run boasts over 30 species of spring wildflowers with a wide range of spring color in bloom for late-March through late-May, depending on the weather conditions. The free Fall Family Fest moved from October to September this year and the 90+ visitors enjoyed outdoor activities on a perfect autumn day. The pay-to-participate educational programs (discounts given with paid memberships) include the Nature Tots program in each of the four seasons (6-12 Tots/session) and the Winter Tree Identification Class held in January. Groups from schools, scouts and civic organizations can also schedule tours with the naturalist throughout the year and participated in a wide variety of service projects. The highlight of the educational programs was the annual meeting in October at Verity Lodge on MUM campus, with Dr. Dick Munson, a retired botany professor from MU as the guest speaker sharing his knowledge of native plant propagation.

Members of Bull's Run's board of directors, the naturalist, Erin Skimming, and volunteers participated in the Earth Day Work Day on site cleaning up the trails and preparing them for the busy spring and summer seasons. Several members marched in Memorial Day and Fourth of July parades to share our presence with the community. Erin, Nancy Clark and Debbie Grant (present and past presidents of BR board) were present at the Butler County Fair with an educational exhibit at the invitation of the Ohio Extensions Master Gardener program. Another educational exhibit was available at National Night Out, with hands-on activities and free temporary tattoos for the children. The Fall Family Fest combined educational and creative activities in a free family oriented event open to the entire community.

Improvements to the 11-acre park were made throughout the year. Work days and numerous volunteers planted seedlings protected by blue tubes to add to the diversity of the woods, taking advantage of the openings in the forest canopy left by the felling of several dead ash trees. The fall workdays saw the main red trail mulched, thanks to Mike Wertz driving a bobcat and several groups removing invasive plants.

Financial support for Bull's Run Arboretum comes from a variety of sources. First and foremost are the volunteers, friends and neighbors who send in donations and memberships throughout the year. There are fund raisers at various times during the year when volunteers help at functions at community events and Bull's Run receives compensation, such as Denny Lumber's Tool Sales and Light Up Middletown. Donations to the Endowment we have established with the Middletown Community Foundation also yields interest to our budget. Our own fund raiser, the Garage Sale, is held each spring through the generous donations of time and items for sale. While Bull's Run does not charge school groups for educational programs, donations from any group are always appreciated.

Changes are coming to the Newsletter

You will notice that this newsletter is again later than usual. We are considering changing the format of the newsletter and seeking a new editor. For the past 13 years, Nancy has compiled the newsletter for Bull's Run, and since 2012 has also served as president of the board of directors and recording secretary. We are considering switching to an e-newsletter in an effort to save paper (and trees) and printing expenses. As we explore this avenue, we are still offering a printed newsletter that will be mailed, but at a new membership pricing. The family and individual membership price will remain the same for those choosing the e-newsletter option, but those preferring to receive a print copy will see an annual increase of \$10 per membership. We were fortunate enough to catch a glimpse of a three brown creepers, along with the usual assortment of woodpeckers, sparrows, titmice, finches and chickadees. basic terminology for using the extensive list of identification pointers in the course materials with practical pictures for reference you can return to often to review and use in your own backyard. Join us on Saturday, February 4, from 1:30-4:30pm, beginning in the Little Hall at the Episcopal Church of the Ascension.

In three hours the participants will learn to recognize distinctive characteristic of more than 20 common trees at Bull's Run and southwest Ohio. We will spend over an hour inside in the Little Hall at Church of the Ascension reviewing the informational material, and then move outside to Bull's Run for field experience and apply the new-found terminology in the woods. Walking in the woods or even driving along the roadways will never be the same!

Erin has plans to expand educational programing into the summer months, in addition to the highly successful Nature Tots. With the enthusiasm generated by last fall's Fall Family Festival, we are exploring new programming. We mounted two bat houses donated to Bull's Run from the American Heritage Girls from Trenton in appreciation of the educational program presented to the group, and are anxiously awaiting spring to see if any bats take up residence.
