# **A SUMMARY OF YOUR ARBORETUM THROUGH 2018**

2018 is drawing to a close at Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum. The Arboretum continues to offer a wide variety of educational opportunities, new community events, and make improvements. All of this is accomplished under the guidance of a volunteer Board of Directors and one part-time naturalist, and with the deepest appreciation to countless dedicated volunteer workers!

The outdoor education opportunities are available in all four seasons. The pay-to-participate educational programs (discounts given with paid memberships) include the Nature Tots program in all four seasons for children aged 6 months to 6 years, with an accompanying adult and the Winter Tree Identification Class for adults. The free programs include spring wildflower walks, early summer tree walk, late summer prairie walk, and a Christmas Bird Count. Our Naturalist, Sarah Meadows, added in monthly events this year, as well,

including a campfire series during the summer and a night Carved Pumpkin Hike in October. The free Fall Family Fest in September entertained visitors with face painting, crafts and outdoor activities on a perfect autumn day. Groups from schools, scouts and civic organizations have scheduled tours with the naturalist throughout the year free of charge. Scouts, high school and college students, and Master Gardeners all participated in a wide variety of service projects. The highlight of the educational programs was the annual meeting in October at Verity Lodge on MUM campus, with Penny Borgman, from the Fernald Nature Center, as the guest speaker sharing the transformation for the former Cold War site to a thriving natural area supporting a wide variety of wildlife, including some videos of the mammals that have returned to the area.



Members of Bull's Run's board of directors, the naturalist, Sara Meadows, and volunteers participated in the Earth Day Work Day on site cleaning up the trails and preparing them for the busy spring and summer seasons. An educational exhibit was available at National Night Out, with hands-on activities and free temporary

tattoos for the children. The Fall Family Fest combined educational and creative activities in a free familyoriented event open to the entire community. Improvements to the 11-acre park were made throughout the year. Spring workday volunteers planted

seedlings protected by blue tubes to add to the diversity of the woods, taking advantage of the openings in the forest canopy left by the felling of dead ash trees. The fall workdays involved removing invasive plants, adding new mulch to the trails and collecting seeds on the prairie, all preparing for another growing season next year.

Financial support for Bull's Run Arboretum comes from memberships, donations and fund raising events. First and foremost are the volunteers, friends and neighbors who send in donations and memberships throughout the year. The fund raisers happen annually when volunteers help at community events and Bull's Run receives compensation, such as Denny Lumber's Tool Sales and Light Up Middletown. Donations to the Endowment established with the Middletown Community Foundation also yields interest applied toward our budget. Our major fund raiser, the Garage Sale, is held each spring on Mother's Day weekend through the generous donations of time and items for sale. # Notes from the Naturalist

#### New 2018 Events



We have had quite a year in 2018, and have offered many new public events. Early in the year we enjoyed a blue moon hike, and tapped the first maple trees in the arboretum for a maple sugaring hike. By the time summer arrived, we had a new campfire story series, including family oriented stories, animals, songs, games, and of course, s'mores! Thank you to the Middletown Historical Society and the Middletown Library Historians for helping with a special campfire night discussing what it was like to attend the Fresh Air Camp that was on the property before it became a nature sanctuary. We ended the summer by placing the first Geocache in the arboretum. With the arrival of fall, we put on our first pumpkin night hike, with 50 lit jack-o-lanterns along the main trail! Due to the success of many of our new events, if you missed out you'll likely have an opportunity to attend in 2019, so keep an eye out for these great new events!

#### **2019 Upcoming Events**

Looking ahead, 2019 is another year full of great events! We hope to continue developing new free public programs and events to offer, and repeat many of our new 2018 events. Bundle up and get outside for a new winter hike series, then warm up with a cup of soup. We are looking forward to working with other local organizations, and inviting more guest speakers to offer the very best knowledge for outdoor enthusiasts. Some events in consideration include a neighborhood 5k race, how to encourage native bees in your yard, and placing an official Ohio Historical Marker. We also look forward to installing a new memorial garden near the entrance, with monuments, native plants, and a memorial bench.

#### Fall Nature Tots

As always, we had lots of fun exploring together this fall! We learned all about owls in our Halloween costumes, dissected owl pellets, and understood how hard migration can be for animals that don't hunker down for the winter. Of course, we had to play in the leaves, and learned how trees are more similar to us than we might think! One of the crowd favorites was camouflage day, when we had to find hidden animals camouflaged along the trail, made camouflage vests to wear, and played a camouflage game. We welcomed some new faces this fall, and look forward to playing in the snow with everyone for winter tots!



# Bird Counts at Bull's Run



The 2018 Christmas Bird Count will be held at Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum on Saturday, December 22, beginning at 10 am. This leisurely walk is open to all interested bird watchers can join us on the trails to sight and record the winter visitors to the woods. You will find the full list of results of the walk on the website, www.bullsrun.org, and our Facebook page after the walk. We would enjoy comments on what you are seeing at your bird feeder in your yard and on your treks through the Arboretum this winter.

Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum will be adding another bird count in 2019 on February 16 at 10am. We will be joining in The Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC), a free, fun, and easy event that engages bird watchers of all ages in counting birds to create a real-time snapshot of bird populations. Participants are asked to count birds for as little as 15 minutes (or as long as they wish) on one or more days of the four-day event and report their sightings online at <u>birdcount.org</u>. Anyone can take part in the Great Backyard Bird Count, from beginning bird watchers to experts, and you can participate from your backyard, or anywhere in the world.

Each checklist submitted during the GBBC helps researchers at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society learn more about how birds are doing, and how to protect them and the environment we share. Last year, more than 160,000 participants submitted their bird observations online, creating the largest instantaneous snapshot of global bird populations ever recorded.

The 21st annual GBBC will be held Friday, February 16, through Monday, February 19, 2018. Please visit the official website at <u>birdcount.org</u> for more information and be sure to check out the latest educational and promotional resources.

# **Our Eighth Annual Winter Tree Identification Class!**

Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum will again offer an informational and fun afternoon, Attendees will be learning basic terminology for using the extensive list of identification pointers in the course materials with practical pictures for reference you can return to often to review and use in your own backyard. Join us on Saturday, February 2, from 1:00-4:00pm, beginning in the Little Hall at the Episcopal Church of the Ascension. Fill out the Program Interest Form on page 6 to register and mail with payment to P.O. Box 425, Middletown, OH, 45042.

In three hours the participants will learn to recognize distinctive characteristic of more than 20 common trees at Bull's Run and southwest Ohio. We will spend over an hour inside in the Little Hall at Church of the Ascension reviewing the informational material, and then move outside to Bull's Run for field experience and apply the newfound terminology in the woods. Walking in the woods or even driving along the roadways will never be the same!
