2022 at Bull's Run

Another year at Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum has ended, with some changes along the way, in addition to the changing seasons. Our goal is to have at least one guided tour free and open to the public every month. January began the year with a Winter Tree Hike following a Zoom class on buds and field cues. Winter Nature Tots explored the "sleeping" season in the woods. February was busy with a Bird Walk and a Maple Sugar Walk, even though Mother Nature did not cooperate with a productive sap flow. March saw the beginning of the Spring Wildflower Walks that lasted into May. April was filled with Spring Nature Tots. June had a Summer Tree Walk. July saw the Summer Nature Tots. August found Caedyn sharing information about Bull's Run at National Night Out, as well as the Prairie Walk. September was when Caedyn announced she was taking a full-time job with Clermont County Parks, but she still honored her obligation to Fall Family Fun. October was without Fall Nature Tots, but the Annual Meeting held at the Great Miami Room at River Center was wonderful with a slide presentation on "Native Orchids of Ohio" presented by Teresa Huesman and Jeanne Rhinehart from the Native Orchid Preservation and Education Society and shared via Zoom. The month ended with a Night Hike led by Caedyn (outgoing Naturalist) and prefaced with a presentation on Bats by Melissa (incoming Naturalist). November featured a Nature Scavenger Hunt sheet available at the gate in honor of National Take a Hike Day. December closed out the year with the Light Up Middletown fundraiser and the Annual Christmas Bird Count.

Many of these programs will be back in 2023, with new program ideas in the works as well. Please be sure to keep current with events as they will be posted on the website www.bullsrun.org, on our Facebook page and on Instagram.

The biggest change moving into 2023 will be the necessity to hire a bookkeeping service to handle payroll and tax statements as the search for a new board member to fill the Treasurer position continues.
