2023 In Review...A Note from our Board President

Each year at Bull's Run Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum, we strive to fulfill our mission of preserving the natural area of Bull's Run while serving as an environmental education resource for all ages. 2023 has been no exception! At the end of 2022, we hired a new part-time naturalist, Melissa Proffitt, to continue providing the exceptional environmental education and land stewardship the community is accustomed to from Bull's Run. This year she continued staple programs such as Nature TOTS and guided hikes, and re-vamped the Campfire Stories with a Naturalist program. Public programs began in January with the Winter Tree ID class, a new Orchid Walk in February, along with the Great Backyard Bird Count. 49 birds encompassing 21 different species were observed at Bull's Run. The first session of Nature TOTS was also held, welcoming our youngest patrons and their caregivers out to the winter woods. Nature TOTS met again in May, August, and October to experience all 4 Ohio seasons. Melissa had assistance throughout the year from intern Alex Nix, a local Miami University student. Such internships help to prepare the next generation of environmental professionals. Alex re-designed our brochure, giving it an updated look and adding content such as the rain garden location. This new resource will be rolled out in 2024 to assist folks visiting the arboretum.

Wildflower walks were held multiple weeks in the spring to catch sight of our early spring wildflowers in March and April. April also brought out 32 amazing volunteers to help clean up the Arboretum during our Earth Day work day. We planted native tree seedlings, removed invasive species, and prepared the trails for spring and summer. During the summer months, Campfire Stories with a Naturalist returned with a partnership with the MidPoint Public Library, and we were awarded an education grant from Middletown Community Foundation to create environmental education loan kits for local schools. Also, Travel Butler County visited and did a feature article and TikTok about Bull's Run. Visit Travel Butler County's website and search for Bull's Run Arboretum to check it out. In September we met with Blended Brood Farms about their Goats on the Go! program. We are exploring the possibility of utilizing this innovative method to use goats to eat invasive species such as winter creeper. Stay tuned for updates about this initiative in 2024! September also saw the return of our Fall Family Festival. We had fun nature games and crafts, pumpkin decorating, live animals, and a scavenger hunt hike. This event is always a great time and a wonderful, free family experience. Then in October we held our Annual Meeting at Middletown River Center. We will finish up the year volunteering at Light Up Middletown and holding our Annual Winter Bird Count in December. Read on to find out more about these events! Bull's Run Environmental Education Kits



We Connect People Who Care

This year Bull's Run was generously awarded an Education Grant from the Middletown Community Foundation (MCF) to create environmental education program loan kits to be available to Middletown students and teachers at no cost! We are busy assembling these kits and creating content aligned to Ohio Science Learning Standards to support curriculum in Ohio classrooms. Thank you to MCF for helping connect us to the people of our community through this opportunity. These kits will contain hands-on biofacts and materials on topics from life cycles, native flora and fauna, trees and more! There will also be kits designed to help get students exploring outside with access to hiking guides and other go-to outdoor equipment. The Arboretum also serves as a fantastic "outdoor learning lab" that teachers can bring their students to further explore these environmental education concepts. The Arboretum is open free to groups every day from dawn to dusk. Our facilities include 8 picnic tables under a shelter house and a port-olet (from March to November. Please note it is removed during the coldest months of the winter)

Bull's Run Arboretum will send out announcements to all of the schools in Middletown City School District with information on how teachers can request a loan kit to borrow for their classroom. Additionally, teachers can contact our naturalist Melissa at brnsaa@gmail.com if they are interested in scheduling a guided field trip.
