Hello Summer!

To kick off the summer season, we held a BioBlitz at Bulls Run Arboretum in partnership with Butler SWCD. This communal citizen science effort focuses on finding and identifying as many species as possible in a specific area over a short period of time. BioBlitz captures a snapshot of an area's biodiversity, and is done fully on a volunteer basis. With help from all of our participants, 259 observations were made and 149 different species of plants, mammals, insects, reptiles, and more were identified. Thank you to everyone who participated in this years BioBlitz event!

Moving Mountains

At Bull's Run, there is always a project to do to keep up with the maintenance and integrity of the Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum. Sometimes the scale of these projects is small and can be achieved by a few dedicated volunteers. Other times, it requires moving mountains- mountains of mulch that is! Over the last few months, generous donations of dropped off mulch escalated into a heaped challenge of getting that mulch to the trails. Amazing volunteers put in sweat equity running wheelbarrows on our park work days but only small gains could be made with muscle alone. Then our partners at Metroparks of Butler County joined the effort.

For four hours on a Wednesday morning, staff from Metroparks of Butler County volunteered their time, knowledge, and skills to clean out garden beds, battle invasive species, and take on the mulch mountain with a takeuchi! (For those like me who are not familiar with this equipment, think larger -than- a- bobcat hauler!) Through teamwork, laughter, and a sense of service to the earth, a large amount of mulch got distributed where we needed it. And uncovered the front butterfly garden that had become buried in the excess! We are so appreciative of support from our volunteers and community partners. Together we really can move mountains!

The summer season brings with it lots of opportunity for water play, adventures in the prairie, and more!
